The Singapore Association for the Visually Handicapped’s “Project Clay IN-SIGHT” was the brainchild of Mr Yong. “I have always wondered what ‘visual images’ a visually impaired person holds in his mind when we articulate ideas such as “palace”, “traffic lights”, “ghost” or “love” and how wonderful it would be if they are equipped with basic pottery skills to transform what they ‘see’ into physical objects through the humble medium of clay,” says Mr Yong.

Besides volunteering at pottery classes for the visually impaired, the family also enjoys helping the elderly. Every year, they do Chinese New Year spring cleaning for the elderly at Tiong Bahru. They are also active in organising eco-vacation trips for families, including trips to Chiang Rai in Thailand to plant and harvest rice.
