# President's Message

66 Not everything that can be counted counts, and not everything that counts can be counted.

- Albert Einstein -

e celebrated our 15<sup>th</sup> anniversary in 2015 and I am happy to present our report card for the operating year ended January 2016.

The demand for after-school care services remained strong across our centres and is expected to remain consistent, if not increase, over the next five years. The Singapore family structure is changing, with multi-layered concerns and needs to be addressed. Both parents are expected to join the workforce as economic reality requires a dual-income household. We have also seen an increase in the number of single-parent families, as well as the number of children who live on the brink of abuse. These trends do not auger well for our children and our society.

After-school care service providers can partner mainstream education to create an enriching, enlivening and empowering experience for children enrolled in such services. Well-run care services can complement our schools' efforts in the holistic development of our children: the former focuses on character formation and virtue inculcation, and the latter on academic learning.

Hence, we embarked on partnerships with organisations, such as the National Arts Council and North East, South East and Central Singapore CDCs for the WeCare Arts Programme to offer 298 hours of enrichment programmes for our children at no additional cost in 2015. The Tan Chin Tuan Foundation also offered their "More Than Words" programme to our children for the last two years.

For our NOVA Learning Intervention Programme, enrolment has remained at 100% throughout the year. Together with our counselling team, art or play therapy was included as an additional form of intervention



for children requiring support in addition to help with coping in school and with school work. We also support parents through coaching or counselling sessions.

Training and Workshops continued to increase its outreach to parents, conducting a total of 1,033 workshop hours and reaching out to 7,000 participants in 2015.

Likewise, for the MSF-funded Positive Parenting Programme (Triple P), we have increased the number of schools served from 8 to 23. As of January 2016, we have already been asked to serve an additional 20 schools.


In response to families that may require additional support in the care of their children, we established a Programmes Department in September. A new CareNights@Morning Star programme was developed to provide respite for parents and care and engagement of children. We hope to offer this programme at all our community-based after-school care centres in time to come.

We have remained faithful to our mission all these years, grown from strength to strength and become more resilient to the uncertainties of the macro environment. Nevertheless, moving forward, we need to cultivate the ability to manage change in our evolving society, as well as within our organisation, so as to remain relevant to the needs of our community.

As a 'teenager' in the social service sector, there is still much for us to learn and even more that we would like to contribute to our community in the coming years.

We are grateful to all our stakeholders, including the Catholic Archdiocese of Singapore, Caritas Singapore Community Council, partners, donors and staff, for their continued and unwavering support.

# After-School Care Services

Morning Star's **After-School Care Services** aims to provide a conducive environment where children can be instilled with virtues for character formation.

Students drop in at the centre during off-school hours between 7.30am and 6.30pm. Our holistic and balanced programme goes beyond cognitive development to the cultivation of coping strategies, a sense of responsibility and a compassionate heart in each child.

In the process, we help children discover the joy of learning.

# Learning Labs

The **NOVA Learning Intervention Programme** was set up in 2006 to help primary school children who have difficulty responding to conventional teaching methods.

Our dedicated facilitators customise learning programmes for each child, and share the parents' joy in witnessing the good progress that the children are making.

The NOVA Learning Intervention Programme has served 118 children since 2013 and is available at our labs at Hougang, St. Anthony's Canossian Primary School, Canossa Convent Primary School and Punggol View Primary School.

# **WeCare**

Since 2014, Morning Star has been working closely with the National Arts Council (NAC) in the *WeCare Arts Programme* to engage our children to various art forms and activity, and help them cultivate an appreciation for the performing and visual arts.

We are grateful for the funding received from the North East Community Development Council (CDC), the South East CDC and the Central CDC in 2015. The funds enabled us to engage specialist instructors to conduct lessons in a variety of arts disciplines for our children.

# **More Than Words**

This annual event supported by Tan Chin Tuan Foundation gives our children the opportunity to be instructed in speech & drama, Nu-Style hiphop and the angklong, a traditional musical instrument of Indonesia.

The learning journey for our children culminated in the "More Than Words" showcase at the Anglo-Chinese School (Independent) on 10 September 2015.



Books from the National Library!

We are extremely grateful for the **1,000 books** received from the National Library in 2015! The donated books have been a great resource for encouraging literacy among our children during silent reading periods.

# CareNights

**CareNights** was developed to offer child-minding services as a support for parents who are experiencing stressful situations in life.

**How.** Utilise existing after-school care centres as child drop-in centres at night, for parents who need some time out to run errands, or simply a respite from a long day of work or caregiving

What. Engage volunteers to conduct wholesome activities like art & craft, music and speech & drama, as well as tutoring in subjects that are based on the primary school curriculum. The centre also organises bi-monthly activities to encourage parent-child bonding and equip parents with effective parenting skills.

Where. Primavera Student Care Centre. In the year ahead, CareNights will also be made available at our centres at Bedok North, Hougang and Sengkang.

# Counselling Services

Our counselling services aim to facilitate sound understanding of coping strategies and help clients work through their situational, emotional and relationship issues.

The services offered fall under two categories, namely school-based counselling for students and community-based general counselling.

2015 saw us extending the reach of our counselling services with significant increases in counselling hours clocked across both categories.

In response to invitations to public discussions on socio-emotional and psychological issues, our Principal Therapist, Ms Kelvyanne Teoh, participated in 938LIVE's radio talk show, A Slice of Life, on the fear of failure and how it affects lives and relationships.

Ms Teoh also delivered a presentation entitled Embracing Hurting Hearts at a Symposium on Divorce, Separation and Annulment organised by the Archdiocesan Commission for the Family.



# Parenting Workshops


Morning Star's parenting workshops aims to empower parents of school-going children by imparting not just head knowledge, but practical skills, on raising emotionally healthy children. Through evidence-based parenting workshops, we equip parents with practical strategies to enhance parent-child communication and improve their child's behaviour.

Our *Parenting Workshops*, held in conjunction with the *Mini Toy Exhibitions*, continued to provide grandparents, parents and children of our student care centres with opportunities to bond over interactive activities. The joyous smiles from the adults and squeals of delight from the children bore testimony to the success of the event!

# **Equipping Our Parents**

We conducted the **Positive Parenting Programme (Triple P)**, in nearly three times as many schools as we did in 2014. Triple P was introduced to schools by the Ministry of Social and Family Development (MSF), and is currently being conducted as a pilot programme.

# **Equipping Ourselves**

At Morning Star, we are character shapers. We go beyond child-minding to inculcate moral excellence in the children under our care.

As such, we have also developed a training plan for our staff to ensure that they are wellequipped with skills in behavioural management, classroom planning and management and coaching.

What's Ahead

- In recognition of our good work, the MSF has awarded us contracts to conduct Triple P In another 20 schools in 2016.
- We are looking forward to sharing our staff training programme with other organisations for their benefit!

"...I used to feel lost whenever my son threw me a curve ball. Trivial matters would quickly escalate into serious problems. We had many ugly confrontations and our home just did not feel like a home.

Through Triple P, I learnt to take control of the situation. Instead of confrontations, I learnt to give affirmation. My son and I have also worked out some house rules and consequences. Even Grandma learnt to give affirmation and is seeing results!"
